Bin Collection and Recycling

Tenements now a fortnightly collection!

As part of Glasgow City Council's Bin Replacement Programme all galvanised metal bins in back courts have now replaced wheelie bins for

general waste and recycling. It is important now more than ever that our tenants are recycling as much waste as they can. The bin collection for tenement blocks is being phased into a fortnightly

collection as a result of the new bins. Any rubbish bags which are not in a bin will not be lifted from bin stores. Please ensure that all rubbish bags are put inside wheelie bins. If you do have excess rubbish then this must be taken to Dawsholm Recycling Centre.

A reminder that all bulk items **must not** be left inside the bin store but outside the bin

Southdeen Park Shed

We had received an increased amount of complaints from our tenants regarding youths and anti-social behaviour in Southdeen Park.

The park is owned by Glasgow City Council and we worked with the Parks Department along with Councillor Carey, Police Scotland, Community Safety and G15 Youth Project regarding the complaints. The removal of the shed was discussed as this was where most groups congregated. G15 Youth Project tried to engage the youths, however this proved unsuccessful and the shed has now been removed by Glasgow City Council.

Councillor Carey advised "As you are aware there was a petition raised to demolish the youth shelter at Southdeen Park due to anti-social behaviour.

A few weeks ago I had a meeting with Drumchapel Housing Co-operative Limited, representatives from Police Scotland, the G15 Youth Project and representatives from Land Services.

At the meeting the G15 youth project were given a week to try and turn things around regarding the use of the shelter. Unfortunately, this did not happen and I therefore instructed Land Services to remove the youth shelter which will be done by now and hopefully this will be to the satisfaction of the residents."



Take a tip...

General maintenance:

- Hoe borders to prevent annual and perennial weeds from spreading and seeding themselves.
- Stake tall perennials to prevent wind damage to flower spikes.
- Liquid feed containerised plants every two to four weeks.
- Keep tubs, hanging baskets and alpine troughs well-watered.

- Use collected rainwater or recycled grey water wherever possible.
- Pot on plants showing signs of being rootbound.

Pest and disease watch:

- Inspect lilies for the scarlet lily beetle whose larvae can strip plants in days.
- Vine weevil larvae can be a serious pest of containerised plants and become active this month. There are various chemical and biological controls available.
